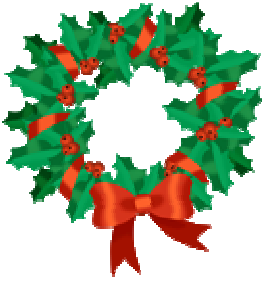

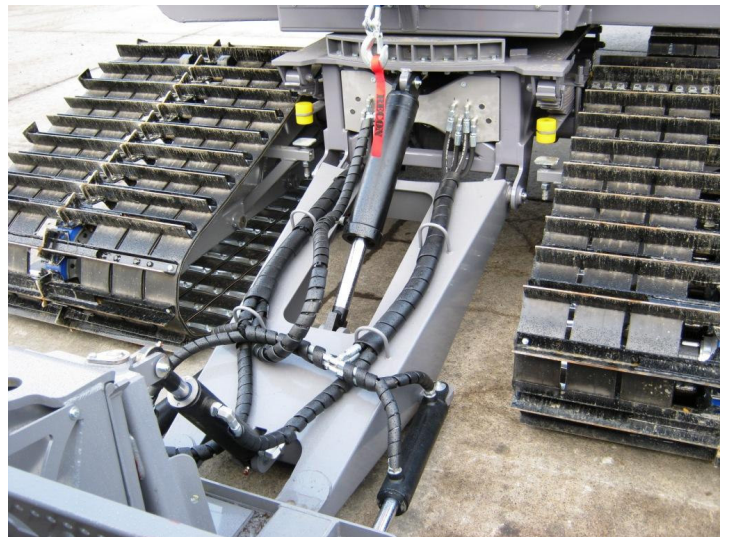
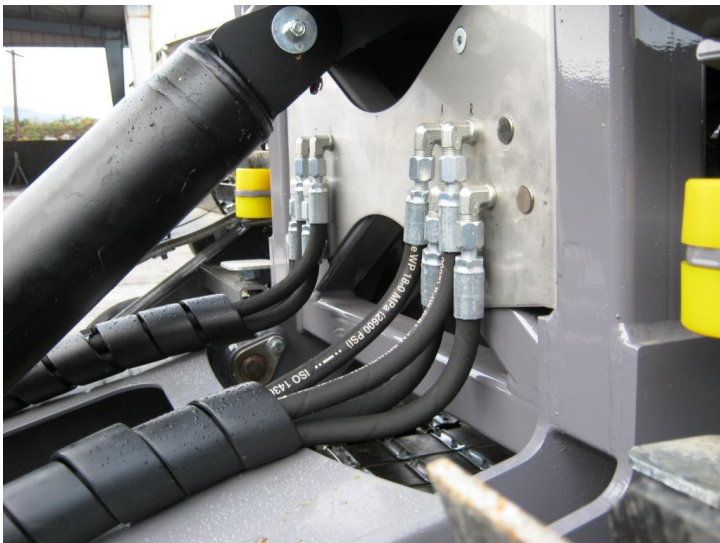

BLADE HOSES

You will notice from the below pictures that we have updated the blade hose routing for the 6 & 8-Way Blades. The goal of this update is hose protection and a cleaner appearance.



BASIC OPERATING AND SAFETY TIPS

- Read your vehicle manual.
 - Make sure your vehicle is in good operating order.
 - Inspect your machine prior to operating, using the daily inspection chart.
 - Be sure all fluids are at the proper level.
 - Be sure the driver is fully acquainted with the machine.
 - Equip your vehicle with survival supplies and be acquainted with survival techniques.
 - Know the operating area before winter.
 - Plan your route ahead and notify someone of your plans.
 - Check the local weather forecast before leaving.
 - Always have a communication device and extra batteries.
 - Check the snow and avalanche forecast for the operating area.
 - Operate your vehicle at a safe and moderate ground speed.
 - Never exceed maximum load capacity.
 - Be aware of uneven terrain, such as moguls, tree wells and side slopes.
 - Do not spin the tracks; decelerate if you lose traction.
 - If you lose floatation, always stop and assess the situation.
 - Be aware of other people around the vehicle and on the trail.
 - Driver and passengers should always wear SEAT BELTS.
- These are a few of the basic operating and safety tips. PLEASE use common sense and be safe.**
