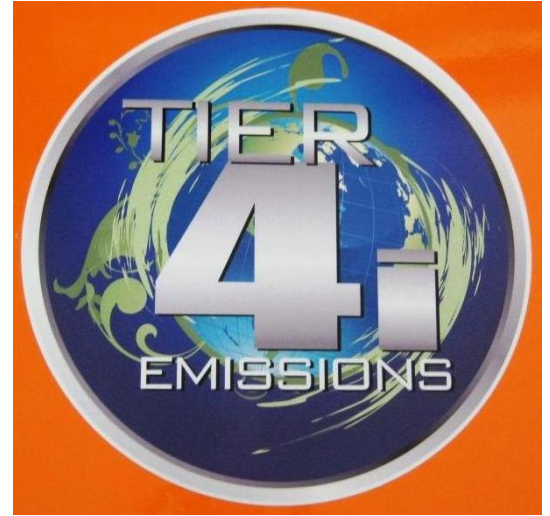

CHANGES FOR 2012

2012 will bring EPA Tier 4 Emissions into the entire product line. The high horsepower groomer has completed its test phase and now it is on to the lower horsepower engines. Tucker Sno-Cat® vehicles will be in the Tier 4 interim phase and WILL NOT be required to burn Urea at this time. The engineering effort to implement these new engines into our vehicles has been substantial. It has also caused us to look at different ways to cool the engine, manage power, and provide increased cool air intake.

This season we will be testing:

- Heated glass, on both the front windshield and side windows.
- Remote controlled exterior rearview mirrors.
- Other things but I can't tell you yet.
