The trail groomers are in the barn by this time of the year but most of the utility machines are used until all the snow is gone. This usually means going out early in the morning when the snow conditions are ok and coming back in the afternoon when it can be very slippery. Its also the time to be careful around tree wells and streams or areas prone to water runoff . Below-the-snow running water and hollowed out areas covered by a thin layer can quickly turn your trip into a real challenge. Mud also comes with this time of year and should be cleaned off the machine at the end of the day.
